


# Your Ceramic Kitchen Sink



## Installation

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### Templates

It's best to use the original template that's included in this box for cutting your worktop.

### Tap Hole Cutting

Make sure whoever fits your sink cuts the tap hole using the guidelines in this box. If you're unsure, you can chat with us on our website.

## Aftercare

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### Looking After Your New Sink

Keep your ceramic sink looking pristine with these simple cleaning tips:

#### Regular Clean

Clean regularly with a mix of hot water and washing up liquid along with a soft cloth to keep on top of small stains. Small marks can be cleaned with our Cramer ceramic polish.

#### Deep Clean

Method kitchen cleaner spray is the best way to give your ceramic sink a deeper clean. For best results, use a soft cloth and spray the solution around your sink, rinsing and repeating to give a thorough clean.

# Avoid Using

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To keep your new sink looking lovely, there are a few things you should avoid using:

## **Abrasive Tools**

Abrasive brushes such as scouring pads, iron wool and even toothbrushes can cause damage to the surface of your sink. Always clean with soft sponges or cloths.

## **Harsh Chemicals**

Stay away from bleach and harsh chemical cleaners that contain substances like hydrochloric and sulphuric acid as these can damage the finish of your brand new sink. You should also avoid using bicarbonate of soda and vinegar as these can leave marks on the surface.

## **Plastic Bowls & Drainers**

Plastic washing bowls can create a build-up of grit which may scratch the glaze of the ceramic, so it's best to avoid these completely or use a bowl with a soft base to protect the surface.

## **Heat**

Placing very hot substances and cookware on your sink may cause marking or even cracking due to rapid expansion. Avoid placing hot pans on your sink and always run the cold tap before pouring boiling water in your sink.

## **Remove Food Stains**

Wipe off any food stains as soon as you can to keep your sink looking fresh. Be aware that foods such as tomato soup, coffee, tea and red wine can tarnish the surface of your sink.
